**From Nov. 1 to Dec. 15, you can drop off new socks at the school and they will get them to those in need.**

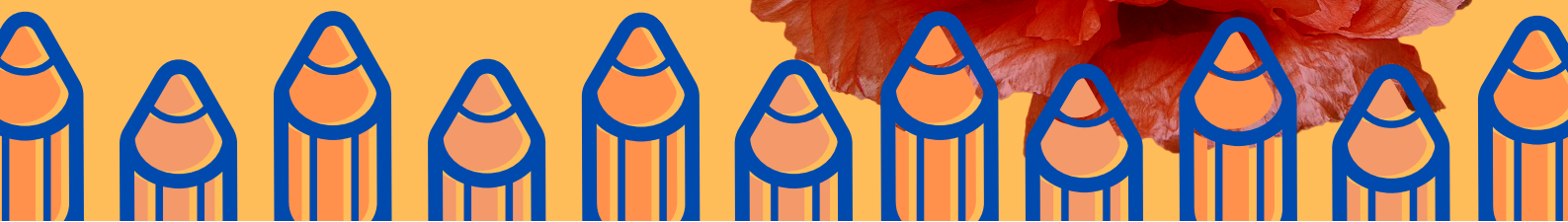

Grade 4 students and Mr. Keenan will be performing at the ceremony.





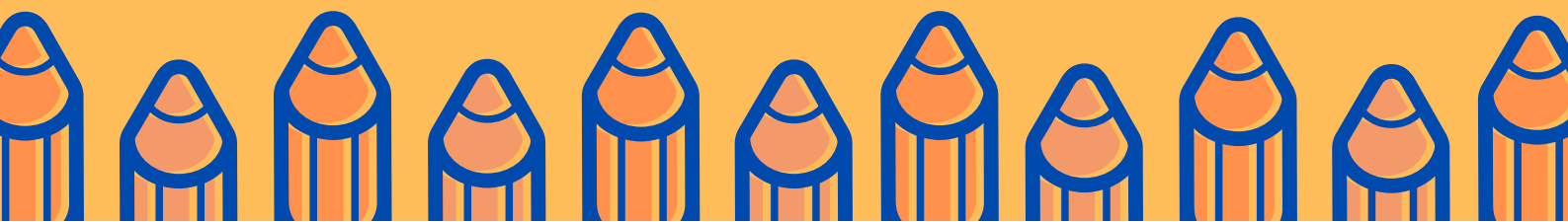

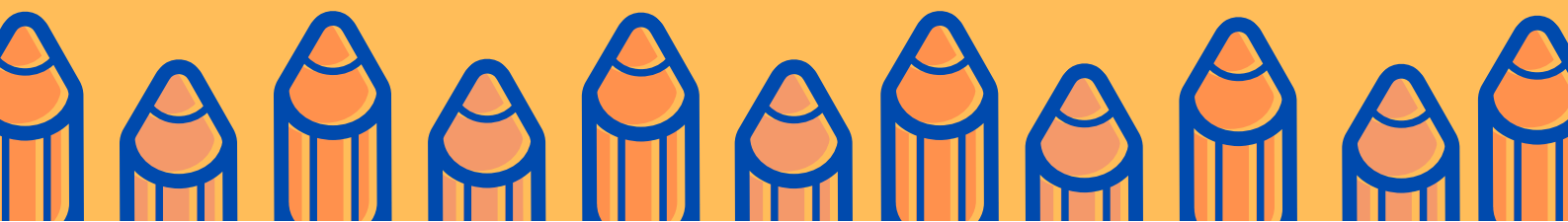
## **Borders**

**By Thomas King and Natasha Donovan**

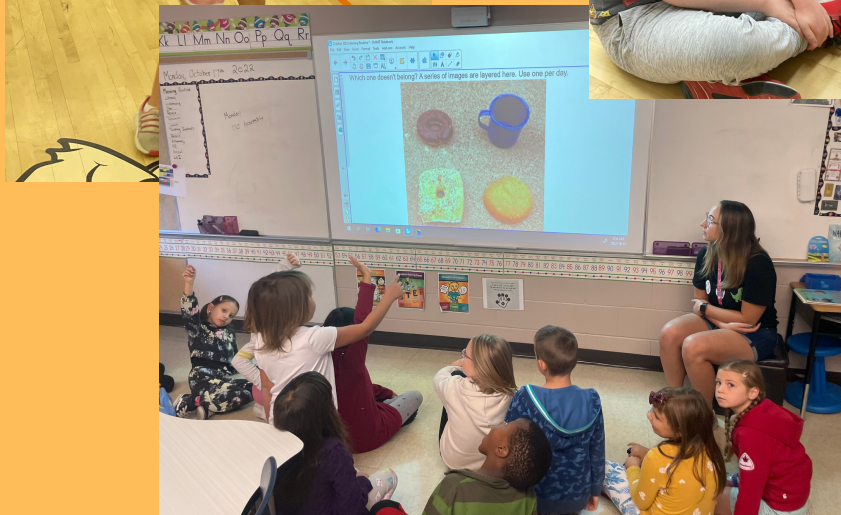

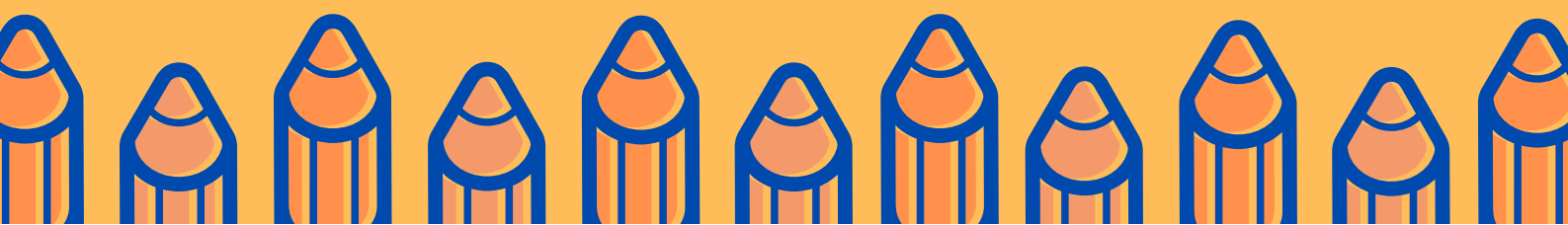

# Galbraith Maker Space Inquiry

Every couple of months, our school's Maker Space asks our students to investigate a new inquiry question. Currently we are exploring: **In what ways can humans control flight?**

**Here is an experiment to try at home!  
Can you build a flying saucer?**

**You will need: a paper plate, scissors,  
and any decorations you like!**



1. With the plate upside down, draw a circle around the base of the plate. Inside the circle, draw lines dividing the circle into 12 equal pieces.
2. Cut along the straight lines.
3. Fold every other triangle up.
4. Press the other triangles down.
5. Have fun decorating!
